National Honor Society Selection Information

MEMBERSHIP

Selection of students for membership in the National Honor Society, one of the highest honors that can be awarded to a high school student, is based on scholarship, leadership, service and character. Membership is not based solely on academic eligibility. Membership is open to qualified juniors and seniors who have been in the school the equivalent of one semester. This period is necessary for students to establish themselves and for the faculty to get to know them.

ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY

Academic eligibility requires a minimum cumulative weighted grade point average of 3.75. Grades are not rounded up. Juniors must have earned a minimum of 10 credits; seniors must have earned a minimum of 15 credits.

LEADERSHIP

To fulfill the leadership requirement the candidate must have demonstrated some of the following and indicate specific examples on the attached form:

Is resourceful in proposing new problems, applying principles, and making suggestions

Demonstrates initiative in promoting school activities

Exercises positive influence on peers in upholding school ideals

Contributes ideas that improve the civic life of the school

Is able to delegate responsibilities

Exemplifies positive attitudes

Inspires positive behavior in others

Demonstrates academic initiative

Successfully holds school offices or positions of responsibility; conducts business effectively and efficiently; demonstrates reliability and dependability

Is a leader in the classroom, at work, and in other school or community activities

Is thoroughly dependable in any responsibility accepted

Is willing to uphold scholarship and maintain a loyal school attitude

SERVICE

To fulfill the service requirement the candidate must have demonstrated some of the following and indicate specific examples on the attached form:

Volunteers and provides dependable and well organized assistance, is gladly available, and is willing to sacrifice to offer assistance

Works well with others and is willing to take on difficult or inconspicuous responsibilities

Cheerfully and enthusiastically renders any requested service to the school

Is willing to represent the class or school in inter-class and inter-scholastic competition

Does committee and staff work without complaint

Participates in some activity outside of school; for example, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, church groups, volunteer services for the elderly, poor or disadvantaged
